## Circumnavigate an Iceberg

## A Fogo Island Inn Adventure

No two icebergs are alike, making each sighting truly unique.

The package includes the chance to luxuriate at Fogo Island Inn, recently named to the *Condé Nast Traveler* 2014 Hot List, and to join Captain Ane and his crew to circumnavigate an iceberg from the comfort and safety of the m/v Ketanja. From their floor-to-ceiling windows at Fogo Island Inn, guests have a front-row experience of the landscapes, seascapes and the icescapes of Fogo Island. On Captian Ane's boat they get a closer look at the wildest and most powerful ocean on the planet. This half-a-day voyage into the North Atlantic Ocean, with the crew of the m/v Ketanja, will come as close as one dares to these 10,000 year old icy marvels. They will witness the icebergs' nothing-else-quite-like-it colour spectrum and the natural rivers that flow over them as they continue their journey southward. And for those who don't fancy a trip on the sea, there are plenty of icebergs to be experienced from the shore.

Rates for the full-board **Iceberg Getaway Package** begin at \$1,495 per night, exclusive of taxes, based on two persons (solo travellers deduct \$200 off base rate per night) and include: a half-a-day community host island orientation, a half-a-day iceberg voyage and full use of the Inn's facilities.
